I was sentenced to the prison on the charge of forgery, and have been here almost two years. I am sorry for what I have done and I feel as though I have been punished enough, and that I can go from here and be a man.

I am a printer by trade and can go to work as soon as I have my freedom. I am an Ex service man and have papers to that effect. I have One hundred Seventy five dollars in the office with which to pay my way out of the state to my home. I have a mother who is seventy Two years old who needs my support badly. I have an excellent conduct here and any officer will be glad to vouch that my words are true. I have worked faithfully ever since I have been here.

Thanking you gentlemen of this honorable board of Pardons for what you will be able to do for me.
