Application of Charles H. Edwards.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Pardon and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of robbery.

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the sixth day of Dec. A. D. 1922; at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in Third Judicial Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Ephraim Hanson presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to Five years to life

and thereafter was imprisoned in the State Prison at Salt Lake City.

Fourth-- Honorable E. A. Rodgers prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Chas. H. Edwards. I was convicted under the name of Chas. H. Edwards.

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: Rork, Van Nixon,

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except Once before
