Dear Sir

at the March meeting of the State Board of Pardons my case will be called for consideration. and it is with the hope of placing some of the more salient points in connection therewith that I am writing you this letter.

I was convicted of passing fictitious checks in the third judicial district court appearing before Judge M. L. Richie on May 3rd 1924. prior to receiving sentence I was held for almost six months in the Salt Lake County Jail regardless of the fact that I had signified my intention of pleading guilty to the charge. with I subsequently did it. Seemed to me that in view of the fact that the state was at no expense whatsoever in the matter of the trial and that I was and at all times during that six months ready to plead guilty to the charge I should be allowed some consideration for the time served in the county jail.

I have now been in the State Prison slightly over ten months which when added to the six makes a total of sixteen months time which I have served in expiation of this offence, my record in here will stand for itself and I am very sure that any of the Prison officials will be glad to speak a word for my industry and general character since coming here.
