That he is confined in the Utah State Prison by virtue of a commitment from the Seventh Judicial District Court, County of Carbon, on a charge of Burglary, Second Degree, having been sentenced on the 6th day of November, 1924, to an Indeterminate Term in the above named Prison:

That his application for Termination of Sentence was denied at the meeting of the Board of Pardons, ~~am~~ held March 20th and 24th, 1925; and that said denial was induced, it is the petitioner's belief, by the fact that at this time I did not have the Committing Judge's approval of such action:

That I now have such a letter from Judge Christenson, the same being attached to and made a part of this affidavit:

Wherefore, your petitioner now prays for a re-hearing on his application for Termination of Sentence, to the end that he might secure his release at this time:

Petitioner further wishes to state to the Board of Pardons, that it is honest intention, whether released now or at some future date, to conduct himself as an honest, law-abiding citizen. That at the time of the commission of the crime for which he is here, he was only seventeen years of age, and did not realize the seriousness of it. The time that he has been here has learned him a lesson that will not be forgotten, and he prays for a favorable consideration of his case.
