

to the defendant. First, give him a copy of it. Let the record show that the defendant in this case has been furnished with a copy of the information.

(The Clerk of the Court thereupon reads Information to the defendant).

THE CLERK: Is Jack Adams your true name?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: Are you ready to enter your plea at this time?

THE DEFENDANT: Why I plead guilty.

THE COURT: You have the right, if you so desire to have forty-eight hours to enter your plea. Do you desire to enter your plea at this time?

THE DEFENDANT: I dont quite understand.

THE COURT: Are you ready to enter your plea at this time?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes.

THE COURT: What is your plea?

THE DEFENDANT: I plead guilty.

THE COURT: Let the record show that the defendant pleads guilty. Are you ready for sentence at this time?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes.

MR. CRAFTS: In view of the fact that Mr. Adams has pleaded guilty, I would recommend that the minimum sentence be imposed.

THE COURT: What is the Statute on that? Now how old are you?

THE DEFENDANT: Thirty-nine.

THE COURT: And where were you born?

THE DEFENDANT: Chicago, Illinois.

THE COURT: Are you a married man?

THE DEFENDANT: No, sir.
