State v. Edward Delgado.

Honorable State Board of Pardons,
Salt Lake City.

Gentlemen:

On the 5th of September, 1922, the District Attorney of this District filed in the District Court of Weber County an information charging one Edward Delgado with the crime of attempt to commit robbery. The defendant was arraigned on the 6th of September and plead not guilty. Subsequently, on the 14th of November, 1922, he appeared in court personally and with his counsel, T. J. Maginnis, Esq., and, by leave of court, withdrew his plea of not guilty and entered a plea of guilty; whereupon he was adjudged to be imprisoned in the state prison for a term of two and one-half years.

The District Attorney, at the time of taking the plea of guilty, represented to me, from the evidence that he had in the case, that a sentence or judgment for one year's imprisonment would answer the ends of justice; and, basing my recommendation upon the representations made to me by the District Attorney, I recommend that the imprisonment of Edward Delgado be terminated on the expiration of one year from the date of Judgment.
