Q Mr. Jensen, you have been informed against by the District Attorney and charged with burglary in the third degree. Are you ready at this time to enter a plea to the Information?

A Yes sir.

Q To the Information, what is your plea, Guilty or Not Guilty?

A Guilty.

Q Are you ready for sentence at this time?

A Yes sir.
