Sir:

Supplementing my letter to you a few days ago, here with find a brief sketch of the affair in California, and subsequent arrest here in Salt Lake. In 1919 I joined the Navy here in Salt Lake and was sent to the Pacific Coast. At that time I was only 20 years old, and I fell in with some companions older than myself, with the result that I was convicted of 2nd degree Burglary and given a four year sentence, with a parole at the end of eighteen months. I was sent to the Road Gang from that State and made good while there. My parole was conditional to me coming to the State of Utah to serve my parole, and I have never left the State. I successfully kept this parole for seven months, and then it was another case of falling in with the wrong sort of companions, with the result that I was convicted of Burglary in the 3rd degree, or rather plead guilty to it, the crime for which I am now here.
