He seems to be determined to do the right thing, and I would recommend to you his parole at an early date, that he may earn money this Summer, and I shall be glad to assist him in finishing high school, and, at a later date, if he continues to make good, would be glad to employ him at this Institution. From this, you may judge that I have a very hopeful view concerning the future of this boy.
