IN RE STATE OF UTAH vs. GUY ROLLAND and
HOWARD D. LINDSLEY.

Gentlemen:

I have to report that on the 2nd day of March, 1923, an information was filed in the District Court of Weber County charging the above named defendants with the crime of robbery. The robbery occurred on February 24, 1923, and consisted of the taking from the person of one J. N. Hill the sum of \$55.00 in money, which was done in the night time and by means of force. On the 2nd day of March, 1923, the defendants were arraigned and subsequently, on the 5th of March, 1923, entered a plea of guilty to the charge. Mr. Hill operated a gasoline service station at or near the corner of 21st Street and Washington Avenue in Ogden City. Just as he was closing up his establishment on the 24th of February he was attacked by the said defendants and the money, being the receipts of his business, taken from him. Shortly afterwards the defendants were apprehended. The money, or a portion of it, was subsequently found concealed in the garage of one Ira Brown. Ira Brown has also been informed against for this same offense.

From what I can learn Lindsley and Brown concocted the scheme to commit this robbery. Both Rolland and Lindsley had been working
