Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May  
A. D. 1923, at Ogden County of Weber  
and State of Utah, in 2<sup>nd</sup> District Court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable James M. Kimball presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to One to Twenty Years  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable Joseph E. Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Nary James Ballard  
I was convicted under the name of Same

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except None but
