One Ford Touring Automobile, License No. 11 555 of the value of \$300.00 lawful money of the United States of America, the said personal property being then and there the property of and in the possession of the said C. J. Samuel; contrary to the provisions of the Statute of the State aforesaid, in such cases made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the State of Utah."

THE COURT: Are you represented by attorneys?

DEFENDANT MARKHAM: No sir.

THE COURT: Do you desire the services of an attorney?

DEFENDANT MARKHAM: No sir.

THE COURT: Do you, Mr. Phfister?

DEFENDANT PHFISTER: No sir.

THE COURT: Do you, Mr. Evans?

DEFENDANT EVANS: No sir.

THE COURT: You are each entitled to one day's additional time, and that would be, in this case, until Monday morning, to plead, and by that means merely to say whether you are guilty or not guilty, and that question means whether you want a trial or not. Now, are you ready to plead? That is, to say whether you are guilty or not guilty now, or do you want to take the time allowed by law?

DEFENDANT MARKHAM: Plead guilty now.
