

DEFENDANT PHILISTER: Plead guilty now.

DEFENDANT EVANS: Plead guilty now.

THE COURT: You will waive further time. Let the record show that the defendants each waive further time to plead, and enter a plea of guilty. That is correct, is it?

THE DEFENDANT MARKHAM: I plead guilty now.

THE DEFENDANT PHILISTER: I plead guilty now.

THE DEFENDANT EVANS: I plead guilty now.

THE COURT: You are entitled to further time, at least two days, if you desire to take it, before the court shall pronounce judgment. Do you wish to take the time, or are you ready that the court pronounce sentence and judgment upon you now?

THE DEFENDANT MARKHAM: Right now.

THE DEFENDANT PHILISTER: Now.

THE DEFENDANT EVANS: Now.

THE COURT: Let the record show that the defendants waive further time for the passing of judgment of the court. I will hear from the District Attorney.

MR. COFFERS: I stated to the defendants that I would recommend that your honor recommend to the Board of Pardons the minimum sentence in this case, which would be one year. So far as we know they have no criminal record, and this is their first offense, and I think that under these circumstances the minimum recommendation will be proper.
