Application of Henry Taylor #4961

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Parole
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Forgery

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the Twenty-fifth day of January
A. D. 1928, at Ogden, Utah County of Weber
and State of Utah, in Second Judicial District Court Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable George S. Barker presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an Indeterminate Sentence
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable Joseph E. Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is John Henry Taylor
I was convicted under the name of Henry Taylor

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: none

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except none

REMARKS: I have never been in trouble of any kind before, and
I am ready to go out and make a man of myself. My
Mother and six year old daughter are both dependent
on my support.
