I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison,
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Forgery

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 25th day of January,
A. D. 1928, at Ogden, Utah County of Weber
and State of Utah, in the Second Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Geo. S. Barker presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term,
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable Jos. E. Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is John Henry Taylor
I was convicted under the name of Same.

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: None.

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except the above.
