Application of W. T. Sampson No. 4978

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Termination and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of second degree burglary

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 23rd day of February A. D. 1928, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in the Third Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge L. B. Wright presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable E. A. Rogers prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is William T. Sampson I was convicted under the name of W. T. Sampson

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: none.

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except 11 months in Nevada for Assault With Intent. The only trouble I have had has been caused thru booze, and I ^{am} thru with it now forever. I am a printer, capable of making \$50.00 a week, and want a chance to take my wife back home and make good. I am asking for a conditional termination to leave the State. I am ready to make good now, and I WILL if given the chance.
