Application of John Cerar No. 3993

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a commutation of sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Murder First Degree.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 10th day of November A. D. 1921, at Price County of Carbon and State of Utah, in Seventh Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Woolley presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to life imprisonment, and thereafter commuted to twenty years by your honorable body and thereafter was imprisoned in the State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable B. W. Dalton prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is John Cerar I was convicted under the name of John Cerar
