Application of Albert Coleman

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of sentence
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Second Degree Burglary

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 29th day of Dec.
A. D. 1927, at Ogden County of Weber
and State of Utah, in Second district Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable James Kimball presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to one to twenty
years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable Joseph E. Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Albert Ellis Coleman
I was convicted under the name of Albert Coleman

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: none

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except once
in Washington
