First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Forgery.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the Sixteenth day of January
A. D. 1929, at Cogden, Utah, County of Weber,
and State of Utah, in Second Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Geo. S. Barker presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to one to twenty years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable David J. Wilson prosecuted the case.
