and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Attempted Second Degree Burglary

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 16th day of March
A. D. 1928, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake
and State of Utah, in Third District Court Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable M.L. Ritchie presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to An indeterminate term of from six months to three years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable A.A. Duncan prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is George Miller Turner

I was convicted under the name of Fred V. Miller

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: None

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except What the records show.
I have a position to go to with the Red River Lumber Company in Westwood, Calif.,
and if I am released will leave the State and never return.
