I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination or Pardon
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 7th day of June
A. D. 1929, at Salt Lake City, County of Salt Lake
and State of Utah, in the Third Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable O. W. McConkie presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term,
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable Ray Van Cott prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Roy Jennings Eichelberger
I was convicted under the name of George Carter

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: George Eccles.

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except the above.
