Application of Gerald F. Snyder

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in The Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Automobile Theft

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 10th day of May
A. D. 1929, at Ogden, Utah County of Weber
and State of Utah, in The Second District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Eugene E. Pratt presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to 90 Day's to 10 Years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable David J. Wilson prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Gerald F. Snyder
I was convicted under the name of Gerald F. Snyder

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows:

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except
Remarks; I am very badly crippled in both lower limbs. 2nd. I wish to go
to the City of Oakland, California. where I will make Horse Hair Belts
and other handiwork for a living. I have a guarantee of transportation
to that City by fellow inmates
