Application of Jean Phillip Bassett No. 5032

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Termination and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in The Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Burglary in 2nd Degree.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 21st day of May A. D. 1928, at Ogden, County of Weber, and State of Utah, in The Second District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Kimball presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to A term of from one year, to twenty years - and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-Honorable Attorney Joseph Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Jean Phillip Thorpe Bassett. I was convicted under the name of Jean Phillip Bassett.

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows:

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except Forgery in State of California.
