Application of Jean Phillip Bassett

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Termination
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Burglary in the 2nd degree

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 21st day of May,
A. D. 1928, at Ogden County of Weber
and State of Utah, in Second District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Kimball presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate term
of from one to twenty years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable Joseph Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Jean Phillip Thorpe Bassett
I was convicted under the name of Jean Phillip Bassett

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows:

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except Forgery
in California - in 1924
