Application of C. C. Spencer #4201

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Parole
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Murder 1st Degree

Second --I was convicted and sentenced on the 19th day of February
A. D. 1923, at Castledale, Utah County of Emery
and State of Utah, in the Seventh Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable George Christensen presiding.

Third--I was sentenced to Life, having been Commuted to 5 years on
November 20th, 1926
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth--Honorable B. W. Dalton prosecuted the case.

Fifth--My true name in full is Charles C. Spencer
I was convicted under the name of Charles C. Spencer

Sixth--The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: None.

Seventh--I have never been convicted of any offense except the one for which I am
now serving.

My sentence will expire on 19th day of November, 1928, which
will be in mid winter, and it will be very hard for me to get a job
or a house to live in, and with only ten dollars, I will experience
great hardship as the coal mines will be filled up with labor, and
it will be very hard for me to get a job at that time.
