I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a PAROLE
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Salt Lake County Jail
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Misdemeanor

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 21st. day of November
A. D. 1928, at Salt Lake County of Salt Lake
and State of Utah, in City Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable H. N. Tanner presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to six (6) months in the County Jail in
Salt Lake County.
and thereafter was imprisoned in the said County Jail at Salt Lake County

Fourth-Honorable Matthew Cowley, Assist. Co. Attorney prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Charles L. Wappler

I was convicted under the name of Charles L. Wappler

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: John Anderson, William (Bill) Bonham

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except About one year ago
I was charged with a felony in Weber County, Utah, and the case
came up before Judge James N. Kimball of the District Court of
Weber County, and I plead guilty. The sentence was suspended
and I was paroled to Mr. Iverson, manager of the Sperry Mills
of Ogden, and in due time I was discharged from parole. This
was about a month before the above offense was committed.
