I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment ~~in~~ On Parole under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Burglary 2nd Degree

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 23rd day of February A. D. 1926, at Tooele, Utah County of Tooele and State of Utah, in the Third Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable William S. Marks presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an Indeterminate Term

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable E. A. Rogers prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is George McBride

I was convicted under the name of George McBride

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None.

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except the one on which I am asking termination of sentence.
